Subject : 7 Corners -- Citizens Meeting with Sleepy Hollow Manor

John, hi.

At Tuesday's meeting (we missed you), I was approached by Ernie Wells of the Sleepy Hollow Manor Citizens Association. He lives right behind our property on Shadeland Drive (the street that has the cul de sac backing into our site).

He asked for a presentation from me, along the lines that I gave the Ravenwood Park Citizens Association. I saw no reason not to comply – I'm seeing him Thursday night, June 19th at the Sleepy Hollow Elementary School.

One issue he's concerned with is that the new elementary school will generate a lot of cut through pedestrian traffic from his neighborhood, across homeowners lots, to the school. He was asking for a barricade. I told him that seems out of step with the notion of pedestrian connectivity between his neighborhood and the restaurants, convenience retail, and medical office we were creating in the Sears redevelopment. I said all this could probably be resolved by pedestrian pathways.

I'm sure there will be many other issues too.

You were instrumental in providing context at the Ravenwoods Meeting. Are you available to join me June 19th? If not – and I understand why – does the process allow me to go solo?
