yesterday, the  
redevelopment at the Sears site will set the stage for this entire undertaking -- it  
is our opportunity to set  
the bar high for the standards of future redevelopment at Seven Corners. Community  
support flowing  
from transparency and good communication will aid in this.

Additionally, as we discussed yesterday and as was proposed by a Task Force member  
at the August 12  
Task Force meeting, we look forward to the powerpoint slideshow that will serve to  
inform the laypeople  
in the community what the revitalization will include and how it will impact them,  
both in the near and long
